



For the uninitiated, The Wisconsin State Shoot is held at the WTA Home Grounds just outside of the small town of Nakoosa right in the middle of the cheese state. The facility was built on 280 acres in 2012 and held its first state tournament in 2013. There are 30 trap fields, a great clubhouse and plenty of RV spaces. They have plans to expand the trapline by 10 traps in the “near future” and because the shoot has become so popular, that is a very good idea.

## WEDNESDAY

The High Over All began on Wednesday July 11 with the Eau Claire Rod and Gun Club Doubles. Cody Barwick led all In State scoring with a perfect 100 straight to win the Junior trophy, however there were four Non-Resident shooters who matched that score. Keith Ditto (KY), Raylee Bishop (IA), Dagan Voigtman (NE) and Mark Zauhar (FL) converted their perfectos into AAA Champion, Lady I, Junior Gold and Senior Veteran trophies.

Next up was the Elite Shotguns President’s Handicap and Brianna



Thompson posted a 99 to claim the In State champion’s trophy without a shoot-off. Chad Blanke was one target behind to win the Runner-up Prize while Matthew Riffe and Gregory Such took home 3rd and 4th places with 97s. Dagan Voigtman and Randy Cook (MN) both broke 27 yard 100 straights to lead the way for the Non-Residents and after a pair of 24s in the overtime rounds, Voigtman was declared the Champion. Cook took home the Senior Veteran trophy.

There were a lot of 100s in YZ’s “We Want Your Body” Singles, 22 of them. Among the winners were Bob Sylla (AA champ), Tate Barwald (A

champ), Sandra Jo Jack (Lady II champ), Sage McKeough (Junior champ), Demaine Milbach (Sub Veteran champ) and Dwight Fitzsimmons (Veteran champ).

## THURSDAY

Forty of the 486 shooters in the White Flyer Singles Class Championship managed to break them all. Tyler Buchanan was the AAA winner after outlasting four others in the carryover. Joseph Schepper needed 50 in overtime to win the AA trophy and Kenneth Sue shot 23-25 to claim



the A class prize. Richard Marshall Jr (NE) was the Non-Resident AAA winner with a 100 in the event and 225 in overtime rounds.

The White Flyer Handicap was the next event of the day and Chad Blanke posted a 99 and then won his shoot-off with Kenneth Sue to take the Champion trophy. Sue finished as the event runner-up and Joe Lehner carded a 98 to earn the third place trophy. Garrett Helms (IL) broke a back fence 100 straight to lead the Non-Resident scoring, while fellow Illinois shooter Kevin White posted a 99 to win the runner-up trophy without a shoot-off. Brothers Wyatt and Barrett Debrie both broke scores of 96 and in their first ever shoot-off together big brother Wyatt came out on top for the Sub Junior trophy.

Tyler Buchanan and Joseph Schepper both broke the top In State scores of 99 to win AAA and AA class trophies in the Davis Construction Doubles Class Championships. Scott Gudgeon had 98 to win the A class prize, while Gerald Tenor broke 96 in B class. C and D classes were won by Clifford Andrae and David Kuenne with scores of 96 and 95. Keith Ditto, Richard Marshall Jr and Raylee Bishop all broke 100s on the Non-Resident side of things. Bishop took home the Lady I trophy, while Ditto and Marshall needed 180 overtime targets to decide the AAA class trophy. In the end Ditto stayed

straight and won the award.

## FRIDAY

There were 462 shooters in the Ho Chunk Doubles Championship and 99 was the top In-State score of the day. Logan Denman, Dwight Fitzsimmons and Cody Barwick shot off for this year's title and after the first round Fitzsimmons was relegated to Veteran winner after a first round 16x20. Denman and Barwick each posted 19s on their first shoot-off round and continued the title run. Denman broke another 19 on the second trap and Barwick broke them all to earn the Champion trophy.

Denman finished as the Junior Gold winner. Kelsey Lorenz and Sandra Jo Jack were the Lady I and Lady II winners with scores of 96 and 92, while Oliver Cran and Jordan Bomkamp were the Junior and Sub Junior champs with scores of 96 and 86. Jeff Vollmar broke 96 to win Sub Veteran after a shoot-off with George Hass and Michael Nawikas finished as the Senior Veteran champion with the score of 95. There were seven 100 straights on the Non-Resident side of the shoot. Raylee Bishop, Dagen Voigtman, Garrett Helms, Keith Ditto, Richard Marshall Jr, Ian Lawrence (IL) and Joe Charnigo all took to the shoot-off fields to straighten out the knot. After four rounds Bishop, Voigtman, Ditto and Charnigo were still in the hunt. In the 5th round Bishop missed one and Ditto dropped two. Bishop took Lady I champion

and Ditto was the AAA winner. Voigtman and Charnigo shot one more perfect round and then decided to shoot a round of Doubles from the 27 yard line to settle it. Voigtman broke 18 to Charnigo's 15 to finish as Champion.

In the Kyle Sacia Memorial Handicap Dan Haag posted a near perfect 99 to win the In State trophy by two targets. Jeffrey Stingl broke 97 to win the runner-up trophy, while Pamela Miles and Gerald Treleven broke the same to win Lady I and Senior Veteran trophies. Robert Gropp was the Junior winner with 96 and Cody Barwick matched that score to claim the Junior Gold award. Jim Hodge and Bryon Fennig also broke 96s to win Sub Veteran and Veteran trophies. Minnesota shooter Peter Walker carded his first 100 from the 27 to win the Non-Resident

SATURDAY

There were 718 shooters who competed in this year's Kolar Arms Singles Championship and while eight of them were able to break all 200 straight only one of them was from Wisconsin. Tyler Buchanan smashed 200 and did not need any extra bullets for a shoot-off, as he won the title outright. Lee Simonar

carded the only non category 199 to take the Runner-up trophy without a shoot-off, but Brad Schultz needed six extra rounds to claim the AAA trophy following his 198. Nick Johnson broke 198 to win AA and Kenneth King broke 197 and then 24x25 to take home the A class trophy. James Woodard and Jerry Vanderwerff both put 196s on the board and were outright B and C class winners for their efforts. Tanner Brey was the D class winner with 195. Brianna Thompson, Sandra Jo Jack and Robert Gropp were the Lady I, Lady II and Junior champions with scores of 198, while Cody Barwick paced Junior Gold with 198 and Jordan Bomkamp took home Sub


